## Overview

This bill establishes mandatory prison sentences, aggravated durational departures, and consecutive sentences for certain repeat offenders.

## **Section Description**

1 Increased sentences for dangerous offender who commits third violent crime.

Requires a judge to impose an aggravated durational departure from the Sentencing Guidelines when a person is convicted of a violent crime that is a felony, the guideline sentence calls for imprisonment, and the person has two or more prior felony convictions for violent crimes. Currently, judges may impose such a sentence.

2 Mandatory sentence for dangerous offender who commits third violent felony.

Requires a judge to impose an executed sentence of imprisonment when an offender is convicted of a violent crime that is a felony, the person has two prior convictions for violent crimes, and the provisions that would require an aggravated durational departure do not apply.

3 Increased sentence for offender who commits sixth felony.

Requires a judge to impose an aggravated durational departure from the Sentencing Guidelines when a person is convicted of a felony, the guideline sentence calls for imprisonment, and the person has five or more prior felony convictions.

4 Consecutive sentences; release.

Requires that sentences imposed on a person who qualifies as a repeat offender under the statute be served consecutively to any other sentence unless a concurrent sentence would result in a longer period of imprisonment. Requires a person sentenced as a repeat offender to serve the entire announced sentence before being eligible for release. Currently, the restriction applies only to a person convicted of a third violent felony.
