Overview

This bill creates increased penalties for arson in cases where the building or property is associated with a political organization or where the act is done to make a political statement.

Summary

Section Description

1 First degree; political organization.

Establishes a crime of arson in the first degree if a person destroys or damages any building through the use of fire or explosives and (1) the building housed a political organization, (2) the offense was committed in whole or substantial part because of an association between a political organization and the building, or (3) the offense was committed in whole or substantial part to make a political statement. The penalty is imprisonment for up to 25 years, a fine of \$40,000, or both. Other forms of first-degree arson carry a maximum penalty of 20 years and a fine of \$20,000 or \$35,000.

2 Political motivation.

Establishes an enhanced penalty for the crime of arson in the third degree if a person destroys or damages any real or personal property through the use of fire or explosives and (1) the property is owned or controlled by a political organization, (2) the offense was committed in whole or substantial part because of an association between a political organization and the building, or (3) the offense was committed in whole or substantial statement. The bill increases the penalty from a maximum sentence of five years in prison and a fine of \$10,000 to a maximum of 90 months in prison and a fine of \$12,500.

3 Political motivation.

Establishes an enhanced penalty for the crime of arson in the fourth degree if a person destroys or damages any personal property in a multiple unit residential building or public building through the use of fire or explosives and (1) the property

is owned or controlled by a political organization, (2) the offense was committed in whole or substantial part because of an association between a political organization and the building, or (3) the offense was committed in whole or substantial part to make a political statement. The bill increases the penalty from a gross misdemeanor to a felony with a maximum sentence of one year in prison and a fine of \$5,000.

4 Arson in the fifth degree.

Establishes an enhanced penalty for the crime of arson in the fifth degree if a person uses fire or explosives to set fire to or burn any real or personal property of value and (1) the property is owned or controlled by a political organization, (2) the offense was committed in whole or substantial part because of an association between a political organization and the building, or (3) the offense was committed in whole or substantial statement. The bill increases the penalty from a misdemeanor to a gross misdemeanor.
